


Easter Monday at Holy Trinity church came alive with a musical journey across Europe from Britain ending in Ukraine. Fiona Bonds had gathered a group of thirteen mostly Herts-based string players from the City of London Sinfonia and the Academy of St Martins in the Fields. Fiona, who lives in Bengeo, is a viola player with those orchestras and wanted to arrange the concert to raise funds for Ukraine. She contacted her colleagues there and included three music students who had family links with the players.

In devising the programme, Fiona said, "I thought about music that reached out towards Ukraine which illustrated the rich cultural scene of Europe. The composers of pieces in the concert came from

the UK, France, Germany, Austria, Slovakia, Romania and Russia. The boundaries of countries in Europe may have changed constantly over time but there are no borders in music as the composers were all influenced by other countries' cultures."

Fiona had less than 6 weeks to organise the players, arrange the programme and rehearse in the run-up to the event. An appreciative full house of about 130 people attended and to date over £2,000 had been raised with more to come from advance tickets sales and donations. The Bengeo Rat Run has been a perennial issue for as long as I have lived in Bengeo. In other words for over 30 years. However, I personally did not understand the problems associated with the rat run until I became involved in the Neighbourhood Plan and began listening to residents.

It soon became clear to me that the current situation is unsustainable and the rat run cannot be allowed to go on as at present.

Residents raised some very simple questions such as:

How can I get my children safely to school? Cars mount the pavement and have on occasion bumped into them?

My children cannot go out of the front door to go and play with the next door neighbour because it is simply not safe.

I cannot go to the coop to buy food because it is not safe to walk on the street.

It is no wonder that residents have been running an excellent, tough and hard hitting campaign to get things changed. The reason is simply one of public safety.

Hertfordshire County Council are well aware of the problem and the need to find a solution. However, as I will show there is no simple resolution.

During our consultations on the Neighbourhood Plan the option of Automatic Number Plate Recognition (ANPR) was regularly raised as a potential solution for the rat run. However, the problem with this is simply that it is impossible to police. One reason is simply that there is not the police capacity to chase up potential wrong-doers; a second reason is that it is almost impossible to prove that someone was not using the rat run for the purpose of visiting a local resident or one or other valid reasons.

Hertfordshire County Council have looked very

carefully at all the options using all sorts of tools and traffic flow monitoring. The following measures have been considered:

#### a) Width restrictions at entry points

The problem with this is that it does not actually stop people using the route. In order to be successful the restricted area would also need to allow vehicles to turn if they could not get through and there is not enough space for suitable turning points.

#### b) Chicanes and traffic priority

Again chicanes don't stop through journeys but could actually add to road safety concerns by slowing down traffic and causing queueing and also potentially aggravate anti social driving.

#### c) A one way traffic system

The main problem with one way systems is that they don't necessarily reduce the number of cars using a route. A one way system on Nelson Road and Wellington Street would increase northbound journey times but Byde Street would still need to be two way. So while it may have some effect on the numbers of cars using the route – the overall effect would not be sufficient to address current concerns.

#### d) Clearer signs at entry points

While clearer signs would emphasise that the area is residential they would not actually stop vehicles from rat running.

#### e) Road closure at the top of Byde Street

This would stop all traffic movement and improve walking and cycling opportunities, access to Bengeo would be restricted to either Beane Road or Bengeo street rather than both as at present.

So the conclusion of the County Council is that road closure is the only viable option to solve the issues of the rat run. But this closure will not happen without prior consultation. The area affected by any closure will be consulted and the results of that consultation will inform the County's decision. While many people will know that this happened once before and in 2008 a detailed study was carried out by the Council. The difference now is that there is a clear recognition that the existing access only system does not work and secondly the situation has become even more dangerous than it was.

While closing Byde Street to through traffic would initially increase traffic using Bengeo Street and



Sacombe Road – there is evidence from other similar closures that over time the overall situation calms. I would say to readers who currently use the rat run that simple measures such as driving off peak and walking or cycling for

shorter journeys can ensure that journey times are no longer than at present. The people that live on the rat run deserve better, and there is not a good reason why they should suffer as a result of the bad habits of some motorists many of whom frankly should not be using the route – which is after all access only.

The fact is that road closure is the only viable option to stop rat running in Wellington and Nelson Streets which is indeed the conclusion of Hertfordshire County Council.

As I mentioned there will be a consultation of affected residents so that if you feel strongly you will get a chance to have your say. But I urge everyone before reaching a conclusion to walk along to the top of Nelson Road at rush hour and stand and observe the traffic for 10 minutes. I think you will understand better why residents are in arms and something needs to be done. The public safety concerns become staringly obvious as indeed is shown by the many photos and videos taken by residents.



## Courtyard Arts News

**Open Exhibition** 



We have just opened our 15th Courtyard Open Exhibition. It was extra special because the last one was held back in 2019. We had 106 submissions and 53 pieces were accepted by the judges. Works were mostly received

from Hertfordshire, but also from Bedfordshire and Buckinghamshire.

This year's winner and 7 commended artists were selected by 3 independent judges. The selection of work was diverse with a contemporary edge, whilst highlighting exceptional use of technique and creativity. Ken Ager was the winner with his piece Inside-Outside X, which is a 3D textile piece.



### **Easter Competition**

In collaboration with Hertford Library, we held our 2nd Easter Egg Decorating competition. Open to all with a winner chosen in 4 age groups. Under 5s, 6–8 years, 9–13 years and 14–Adult.

All entries were hung in the window of Hertford Library with the winners chosen this year by Hertford Library Manager, Dave. Winners were: Maisie, aged 4 years; Zac, aged 8; Ethan, aged 11; and Barbara, Adult.

## The Company of Players



### **Success at Hertford Theatre Week**

Hertford's The Company of Players picked up three of the five awards at the 2022 Hertford Theatre Week.

Andy Lee's CoPs production of *The Hound of the Baskervilles* won the Festival, receiving the Mercury Challenge Cup as well as the Freston Salver – the Audience Appreciation Award where members of the audience who hold a weekly ticket vote for the play which they have enjoyed the most. Mel Powell's CoPs production of *Eventide* won The Roy Seammen Award for Stage Presentation. Both plays received fantastic assessments from adjudicator, Chris Jaeger MBE. The marks at the top were very close and all the marks were very high compared with some previous years.

Other nominations included Des Turner's performance in *Eventide* and Andy Lee's direction of *The Hound of the Baskervilles*. Chris Jaeger made the point that Hertford is pretty unique in not having specific best actor or director categories for adjudicators to award – although he did say that at a recent festival he had worked on had 22 awards for 11 plays was a bit too far the other way!

CoPs were happy to help out by putting in two productions as there were insufficient entries from other societies.

The next and last play of CoPs for this season is When The Rain Stops Falling by Andrew Bovell, directed by Laura Ilinca, 8th–16th June 2022. This is a drama that spans 4 generations over 80 years, starting in 1959 in London and ending in 2039 in Adelaide. Tickets are available on CoPs website www.cops.org.uk.

## In memory of Morna Lane

Morna lived in Trinity Grove for much of her married life and brought up her five children there. Her house was next door to Joan Norris and you could often see her working in her garden when visiting Joan.

Morna took a language degree in London and worked in a language school before her marriage, and later at Longmores for many years. Her knowledge of five languages was impressive by any standards. This stood her in good stead when Holy Trinity church exchanged visits with our twin Italian parish of Cucurrano. They were very sorry to hear of her death and prayed for her in church on the following Sunday.

She loved travelling and was a very hospitable host to visitors from the towns twinned with Hertford. She had many other interests, notably music and singing, and she was an invaluable member of the church choir for many years. She came originally from Scotland from the Kingdom of Fife as she described it and she loved Scottish

Dancing, as those of us who attended her 90th birthday could testify!

Morna belonged to Hertford Choral Society, Scottish Dancing Society and play reading, Shakespeare, language and poetry groups. Her reading of Scottish poetry was always something to look forward to.

She was essentially a private person, but with a deep hinterland and great courage in the face of troubles. Her marriage to Eric Lane, late in life, gave them both much happiness to begin with and her innate strength and firm faith sustained her in the subsequent years of his illness. Her first husband, David Braybrook, was a bellringer at Holy Trinity for many years.

She will be sorely missed by her family and friends and Holy Trinity will miss her in the front row of the altos in the church choir. She was a very special member of the community of Bengeo and of the Parish church.

## A Word from The Rectory Oh God, help

### From The Vicar, The Revd Robert Thompson



'Our prayers are with Ukraine.' Our heartfelt prayers are with the family right now.' My thoughts and prayers go out to her.' If every prayer meant became a prayer said then the lines to God must be pretty busy now. Even the intention to pray makes a difference – whether or not you believe God is listening, prayer never leaves

things unchanged. An offer of empathy, kindness, compassion or fellow feeling is good for us before it benefits anyone else. Maybe we should all be looking for somewhere to pray and someone to pray with?

Almost twenty years ago, my colleague David started a prayer group that met in church every Tuesday night. Over the years people have come and gone, but the group still meets. They have prayed through personal crises and national emergencies, through wars, government collapses, stock market crashes, environmental disaster and a global pandemic.


Were all their prayers answered? Clearly not. Was every request met? Not really. True, there were desperate prayers said for a baby who survived a horrific birth; there were also fervent prayers for a saintly member of the prayer group who didn't come through cancer. Did they give up praying after that? Of course not.

They still pray now. Lots. Twenty years of practice has made prayer a life habit – their reflex response to a screaming newspaper headline, or the siren of an ambulance hurtling down the road, or the rumble of a funeral hearse progressing up Bengeo Street.

But none of them would claim to be experts or specialists. In its widest sense, prayer is a universal human activity, as elemental as breathing. For some it springs from a yearning far deeper than simply needing to get stuff we want. We know (unless deluded) that we can never completely control our personal lives or events in the world. So we bridge the gap between what we do and what is done to us by longing, lamenting, despairing and hoping.

Prayer can sometimes feel like wishful thinking. But that's OK. Dreams are wishful thinking. World peace is wishful thinking. For things to be 'on earth as it is in heaven' is wishful thinking.

Perhaps that's why people say they will pray for someone: because it gives wings to hope, picking it up and giving us a place to take it. Abraham Lincoln said, 'I'm driven to my knees by the overwhelming conviction that I have somewhere else to go.' At its most basic, we utter prayers in the hope that there is something good underpinning all of life, something at the core of existence that can bring stability to our wobbly lives in a volatile world.



Prayers don't have to be long or eloquent and require no more faith than we've already got. The novelist Anne Lamott taught me the three best prayers I know: Help, Thanks, Wow! Jesus himself said that shorter prayers are better. When the disciples asked him to pray, he gave them the Lord's Prayer, one of the pithiest mixes of poetry and practicality ever uttered.

So those who send out prayers need use only small words, but with great intentions. My suggestion?

Make them thankful, make them honest and be direct, and do it all with a confidence and hope that the prayers you say, whether offered from church pews or street corners, cathedral cloisters or breakfast tables, do not go out and come back void, but are heard by a God who is a very present help in times of trouble.


